## Romans 1:9, 10 The Christian's Life of Requesting Prayer (Part 2)

- I. The Christian's Life of Requesting Prayer is not Inconsistent with Service for the Lord 1:9, 10.
- II. The Christian's Life of Requesting Prayer Directs Service for the Lord 1:9, 10.
  - A. Christian Service is Religious Service in Character: "serve."
  - B. Christian Service is Sincere Service in Manner: "in my spirit."
  - C. Christian Service is <u>Gospel</u> Centered in Content: "in the Gospel."
    - 1 Corinthians 2:2; Isaiah 52:7; Acts 20:27; Colossians 1:28.
  - D. Christian Prayer is <u>Unceasing</u>: "unceasingly; always." Ephesians 6:18; 1 Thessalonians 5:17.
  - E. Christian Prayer and Service is Concerned for <u>Others</u>: "of you; to you."
  - F. Christian Prayer and Service is Entirely Submitted to God's Will: "by the will of God."
    - 1. James 4:13, 15; Acts 21:14; Luke 22:42.
    - 2. This is not: 1) going by my own ideas (Psalm 119:105), 2) wanting to consume it on my own desires (James 4:2, 3), nor 3) agitation when things don't go my way.
- III. The Christian's Life of Requesting Prayer Changes the <u>Person</u> Praying 1:9-12.

- Pray that for your life, prayer & service for the Lord would follow the pattern modeled for us in Rom. 1:8-10.

- 10. What are some of the requests that Paul probably prayed for the Roman church (hint: Romans 1:1-10)? Were any of those prayers answered (hint: Romans 1:8)?
- 11. What are some prayer requests that we should be praying for others based on Ephesians 3:14-21; Philippians 1:9-11; Colossians 1:9-11.
- 12. What are the items mentioned in Romans 1:8-10 about which we should be praying for ourselves and our church family?
- 13. What should be included in our prayers (James 4:13, 15; Luke 22:42)?
- 14. How can I be sure that I'm relying on God's will and not my own ideas (Psalm 119:105)?
- 15. What does it mean to pray things that I consume because of my own desires (James 4:2, 3)?
- 16. If God accomplishes His plan, what's the purpose of praying?
- 17. How does prayer change the person who is doing the praying?
