## Romans 1:27 - Wrath Revealed: God Abandons Man to Dishonoring Passions (Part 2).

- Theme: We must understand God's view of LGBTQ.
- I. Christian Thinking about the LGBTQ Practice Romans 1:26, 27.
  - A. God Himself Gives Mankind Over Ro 1:26b (Psa 81:12).
  - B. God Has Reasons for Giving Mankind Over Ro 1:24-26a.
  - C. God Gives Mankind Over to a Particular Abandonment Ro 1:26c-27.
    - 1. The essence of this abandonment is degrading passions Ro 1:26c (Lev 18:22; 1 Cor 6:9-11; Eph 2:3; Col 3:5; Jam 1:13, 14).
    - 2. The expression of this abandonment is unnatural sexuality Ro 1:26d-27a.
      - a. Women Ro 1:26d.
      - b. Men Ro 1:27a.
        - i. The person abandons (forsakes) the natural function (sex) of women.
        - ii. The person burns in desire for others of the same sex (Gen 19:11).
        - iii. This person commits indecent acts with others of the same sex (Mat 5:21, 22, 27, 28).
    - 3. The extent of this abandonment is receiving the due penalty Ro 1:27b (Gen 18:25; Luk 6:34; 23:41; Gal 6:7, 8).

## II. Christian Thinking about the LGBTQ Person - Romans 1:28-32.

- A. All people, believers and unbelievers, are made in the image of God (Ge 1:26-28).
- B. All people, believers and unbelievers, must be treated with compassion, dignity, love, kindness & respect (Matthew 7:12; Mark 12:28-31; Luke 6:31; Romans 12:10; Jude 1:22, 23). Hateful and harassing behavior or attitudes directed toward any individual are to be repudiated and are not in accord with Scripture (Ephesians 4:29, 30; 5:4; Colossians 3:8; 4:6).
- C. All people, believers and unbelievers, are sinners (Rom 3:10, 23).
  - 1. Other people's sins may not make sense to you, but it makes perfect sense to them (Jam 1:13, 14).
  - 2. The sins that we commit are just as much against God as the LGBTQ (Rom 1:28-32; 1 Corin 6:9-11).

- D. All sinners who confess and forsake their sin through faith in Jesus Christ alone can receive redemption and restoration (Psa 8:4; Matthew 11:29-30; John 3:16-18; Acts 3:19-21; 16:31; Romans 3:19-4:5; 6:23; 10:9-13; 1 Corinthians 6:9-11; 10:13; 15:10; Ephesians 2:1-10; Hebrews 2:17, 18; 4:14-16).
- Have some humility: "There, but for the grace of God, go I."
- E. All Believers must love all unbelievers to the light of the gospel of Jesus Christ (Jude 1:22, 23).

Conclusion - "I have never despaired for any man since God saved me."

## Questions for Thought and Discussion.

- From this message, what was the truth that stuck out the most to you?
- 2. How are sinful desires of any kind and acting on those desires different? How are they the same?
- 3. In Romans 1:27, is God speaking about AIDS? Why or why not?
- 4. Time magazine ran a cover story on AIDS: "The Big Chill: Fear of AIDS." Is says that AIDS is "a vague sort of retribution, an Old Testament-style revenge... AIDS pushes monogamy right back up there on the priority list." What are we to think that even the world sees as stated in this article?
- 5. Can a person legitimately justify LGBTQ issues according to proper Bible study? What are some of the words God uses in Ro 1:26, 27 to let us know?
- 6. What is a Christian to think about the LGBTQ practice?
- 7. What is to be the Christian's attitude toward individuals who are enmeshed in depravity?
- 8. Is the reprobate mind of Rom 1:28 more associated with a) homosexuality (Rom 1:26, 27) or with b) a list of sins (Rom 1:29-32)? Why do you think that most people associate LGBTQ sins with being reprobate and not the list of sins in Rom 1:29-32?
- 9. What is the only hope for all sin & sinners? How does 1 Cor 6:9-11 address this?

## **Thoughts for Prayer**.

- 1. Pray that God would help us all at Grace to understand God's perspective on the LGBTQ practice.
- 2. Review each of the five points under "Christian Thinking about the LGBTQ Person." Pray that God would up us all at Grace to practice that thinking and behavior toward everyone.
